## Master Esthetician Program:

This program prepares individuals to massage and treat the face, neck, and body with advanced chemical and cosmetic preparations and esthetic medical treatments, and to function as licensed estheticians in salons and spas. Includes instruction in advanced anatomy and physiology, skin properties and disorders, sanitation and infection control, advanced facial treatments, spa body treatments, advanced extractions, corrective makeup, chemical peels, microdermabrasion, lymphatic drainage and advanced massage techniques, pre- and post-operative esthetic skin care, client/patient evaluation and care, applicable laws and regulations, and business practices.

Program has the necessary skills to become a Licensed Esthetician, and subsequently to enter the job market at an entry-level position. It should be noted that the program costs include the costs of the state's Practical and Theory License Exam, which are required to be passed by the graduate prior to being employable in the field. To take the State License Exam, a student must graduate from a 750-hour program approved by the State Board of Cosmetology. The length of our 750-hour approved program is 30 weeks. This program includes remote learning/distance education activity hours, up to 50% of total theory program hours. Distance Education activities include contemporaneous, visually and verbally, interactions between the instructor and student learning through zoom and online interactive CIMA software.

Objectives of the course include:

1. To develop the knowledge, and understanding of the theory of Esthetics, as well as the skill and appreciation of the practice of Esthetics.
2. To develop good habits in sanitation procedures.
3. To learn proper care and utilization of supplies and equipment for skin properties and disorders
4. Instruction in advanced anatomy and physiology and infection control.
5. Presents students with instruction on advanced facial treatments, spa body treatments, advanced extraction, chemical peels, and microdermabrasion.
6. Introduces students to lymphatic drainage and advanced massage techniques, and pre- and post-operative esthetic skin care
7. Instructs students on makeup and corrective makeup applications
8. To prepare students for the State Board examination to obtain a license to practice Esthetics.
